A Home of Our Own

Three years ago, Lovelane received an extraordinary gift from the grandparents of a Lovelane student. They offered to build an indoor arena for Lovelane if we would locate and purchase land and raise the money to build the rest of the facility. For two years, a volunteer committee searched for an appropriate site and made plans for a capital campaign. In December 2002, Lovelane found the perfect location, a 5-acre parcel in Lincoln. This will be Lovelane's first permanent home after more than 15 years of providing riding therapy.

We plan to build a state-of-the-art therapeutic riding facility with a heated indoor arena, an outdoor ring with access to public riding trails, a viewing room, full wheelchair access, a therapy room, office and a barn manager's apartment. The new facility will have a 17,500 square foot barn/indoor arena and an 11,000 square foot outdoor riding arena.

Consolidating our operations into one beautiful facility will make riding at Lovelane an even better experience for our current students, and it will allow us to ride year-round regardless of weather conditions—no more cancelled lessons because of snow, rain, heat or cold! We will also be able to have more horses in our new facility, so it will help us to reduce our lengthy waiting list.

Now that Lovelane has found and purchased the perfect piece of land to build a new therapeutic riding facility, we need to raise the money to pay for it. To help with this, we have launched **Heroes on Horseback**, a \$4 million capital campaign. For more information about Lovelane's Capital Campaign, give us a call at 781-259-1177. Superman Comes to Lovelane

Lovelane was recently awarded a \$10,000 Quality of Life grant from the Christopher Reeves Paralysis Foundation. The grant will be used to build or purchase new wheelchair accessible mounting ramps and pave a path to our outdoor arena. This will be especially helpful for our students in wheelchairs or with limited mobility. The Quality of Life Program awards grants to programs that improve the daily lives of people living with disabilities, particularly spinal cord injuries. It is awarded twice yearly and categories include: accessibility, education, independent living, sports activities, health promotion and therapeutic riding. Lovelane is proud to have been awarded such a grant. 

Creating an Endowed Scholarship Fund

Over the last five years, the cost of providing riding therapy has risen rapidly. Although the true cost of a half-hour session at Lovelane is currently more than \$100, a tuition subsidy to 75 percent of our students allows them to pay only \$60 per session.

Reductions in respite funding and other resources have strained many family budgets. As parents struggle to maintain riding therapy in their child's array of therapeutic interventions, we recognize the need for scholarship support, discounts, or alternative payment plans based on individual financial situations.

Scholarship funds, granted to about 28 percent of students, make it possible for some families to receive additional tuition assistance. Scholarship funds come from individual, corporate and foundation gifts, but the need is now so great that a permanent and sustainable solution must be created.


In order to maintain our commitment to economic access, Lovelane is creating an endowed Student Scholarship Fund. Interest income from this fund will provide financial aid to many of our students and ensure that every child who comes to Lovelane will have the opportunity to participate. The Student Scholarship Fund was the beneficiary of this year's Course Brook Farm Schooling Horse Trials.

On November 19, 2003, the Boston Celtics presented the prestigious Heroes Among Us award to Debby Sabin Kanzer, founder and Director of Lovelane, for her innovative horseback riding program for children who have special needs. Kanzer was introduced to the crowd during the second quarter of the Celtics' game against the New Orleans Hornets at the Fleet Center.

Debby Sabin Kanzer, a registered occupational therapist and former Special Olympics equestrian team coach, founded Lovelane in 1988. The Lovelane program uses horseback riding to provide physical and other therapies to children with a wide range of significant special needs—from cerebral palsy and spinal cord injuries to rare genetic disorders and terminal illnesses.

Established as an initiative of the Boston Celtics Charitable Foundation in the fall of 1997, the Heroes Among Us program honors individuals who have made an overwhelming impact on the lives of others. The Heroes Among Us award is presented at

each home game to an individual or individuals who, through their unique commitment and humanitarian spirit, have made exceptional and lasting contributions to our community.

"Thanks to the wonderful work of Debby Sabin Kanzer and Lovelane, children who have special needs are able to receive their therapy while building self-confidence and experiencing the joys of riding a horse," said Meghan Wright, the Celtics' Senior Director of Community Relations. "She is truly deserving of the Heroes Among Us award." U

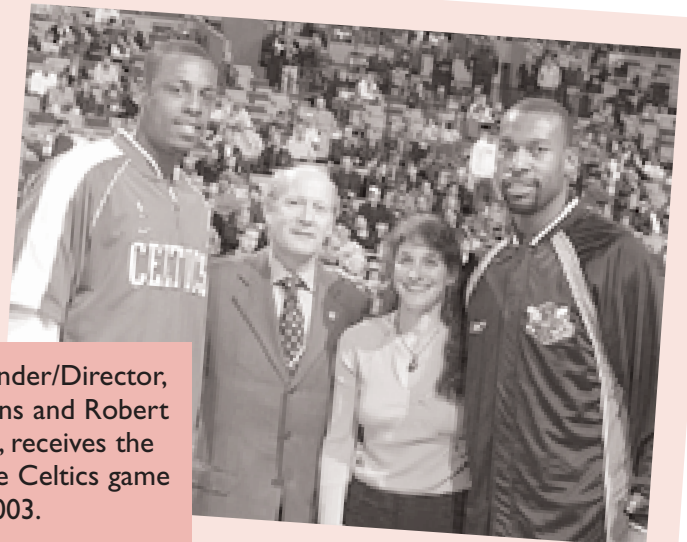
From A Parent's Point of View

My daughter, Delaney, has cerebral palsy and is unable to walk or sit unassisted. Doctors and therapists told us therapeutic riding would be great for her body, so Delaney started at Lovelane when she was 2 years old. We thought we might notice a difference in her posture and strength after riding, but we had no idea what it would do for her self-esteem!

Now Delaney is 4 years old. I recently attended her weekly lesson, and I brought along her 2 year-old brother who had not been there in a while. He was looking up at her on that big horse with such admiration, so proud of his big sister. He was waving at her, she was waving and blowing kisses at him. I thought about how much this program has brought to her, and not just physically (although she is sitting up much stronger and supporting herself more than ever). I saw a sparkle in her eye that day that I had not noted before. She is proud of herself and happy that she has something special to be proud of.

We started with Lovelane because we thought it would be good for our daughter physically. Now, 2 years later it has become so much more. This is a very special place for her that she truly loves.
